#### Pre Disaster Mitigation Plan Public Survey

#### Overview

The Central Massachusetts Regional Planning Commission (CMRPC) through a federal grant is working in conjunction with your community to create a Natural hazards Pre Disaster Mitigation Plan. The Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) program provides funds to states, territories, Indian tribal governments, communities and universities for hazard mitigation planning and the implementation of all hazard mitigation projects prior to a disaster event. These plans and projects reduce the overall risk to the population and structures, while also reducing reliance on funding from actual disaster declarations. This plan is intended to reduce the vulnerability of citizens, critical facilities, infrastructure, private property, and the natural environment within the town.
